

Joplin Regional Airport Launches On-Line Survey to Determine Demand for Flights on Larger Aircraft to Different Hub Airports

Survey Will Help Determine Where Business Travelers Are Going, How Often They Fly, and If There's Sufficient Support for New Service

Now is your chance to have a say in the future of air service in Joplin. The Joplin Regional Airport has launched an air service survey, collecting data on local travel patterns that will be shared with prospective airlines to support the case for regional jet aircraft to a new hub in the next cycle of Essential Air Service (EAS) bidding. The results of the survey will reveal the number of trips local travelers take each year, which airports they're using now, where they're traveling to, and what local travelers would support in terms of different local service at the Airport.
